Resolution # 2025-01

A Resolution Creating Educational Guidelines for Racial Reconciliation Formation for Leaders in the Episcopal Diocese of Wyoming

Whereas, the Episcopal Diocese of Wyoming has made a commitment to *Becoming Beloved Community*, which is the Episcopal Church's long-term commitment to racial healing, reconciliation, and justice in our personal lives, our ministries, and our society;

And whereas, The 81st General Convention of The Episcopal Church ("TEC") adopted Resolution 2024-A035 - Establish Model Policies for Anti/Racism/Racial Reconciliation Work, and TEC recommitted itself to the work of the Church as articulated first at the 70th General Convention in 1991-D113 which called the Church to address racism inside our church, within society, and in our world;

And whereas, Said Resolution 2024-A035 has called for every diocese to create Model Policies for Dismantling Racism, Racial Reconciliation, and Healing including education and training for all clergy, lay employees, and lay leaders;

And whereas, *Sacred Ground*—part of *Becoming Beloved Community*—is a film- and readings-based dialogue series on race, grounded in faith, which is open to all;

Resolved, That the Episcopal Diocese of Wyoming establish *Sacred Ground* as its foundational Dismantling Racism, Racial Reconciliation, and Healing training course;

Resolved, That *Sacred Ground* be included in regular educational offerings of the Diocese of Wyoming.

This Resolution was approved and adopted by the 59th Diocesan Convention on the 11 day of October, 2025.
